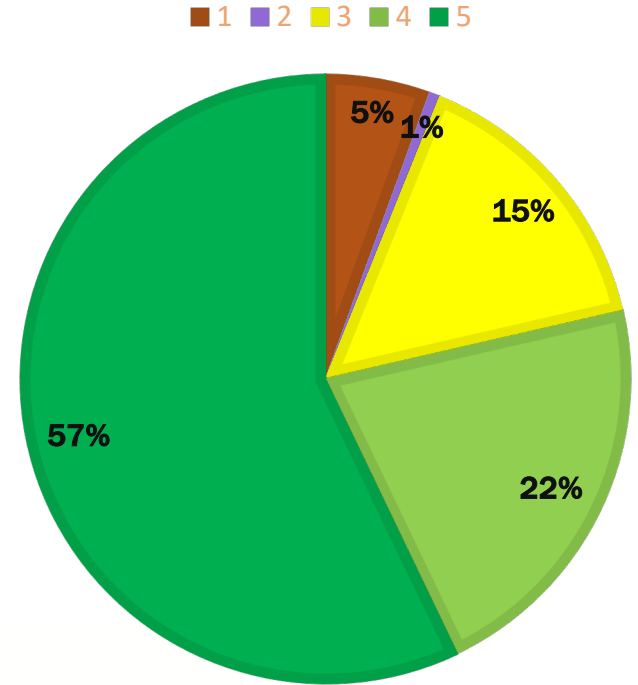
# UVA Health Sustainability Engagement Survey

- Intended for UVA Health employees and contractors
- Goal to collect information about:
  - Support for sustainability
  - Sustainability topics of greatest interest
  - Engagement opportunities
  - Feedback
- Received 166 responses

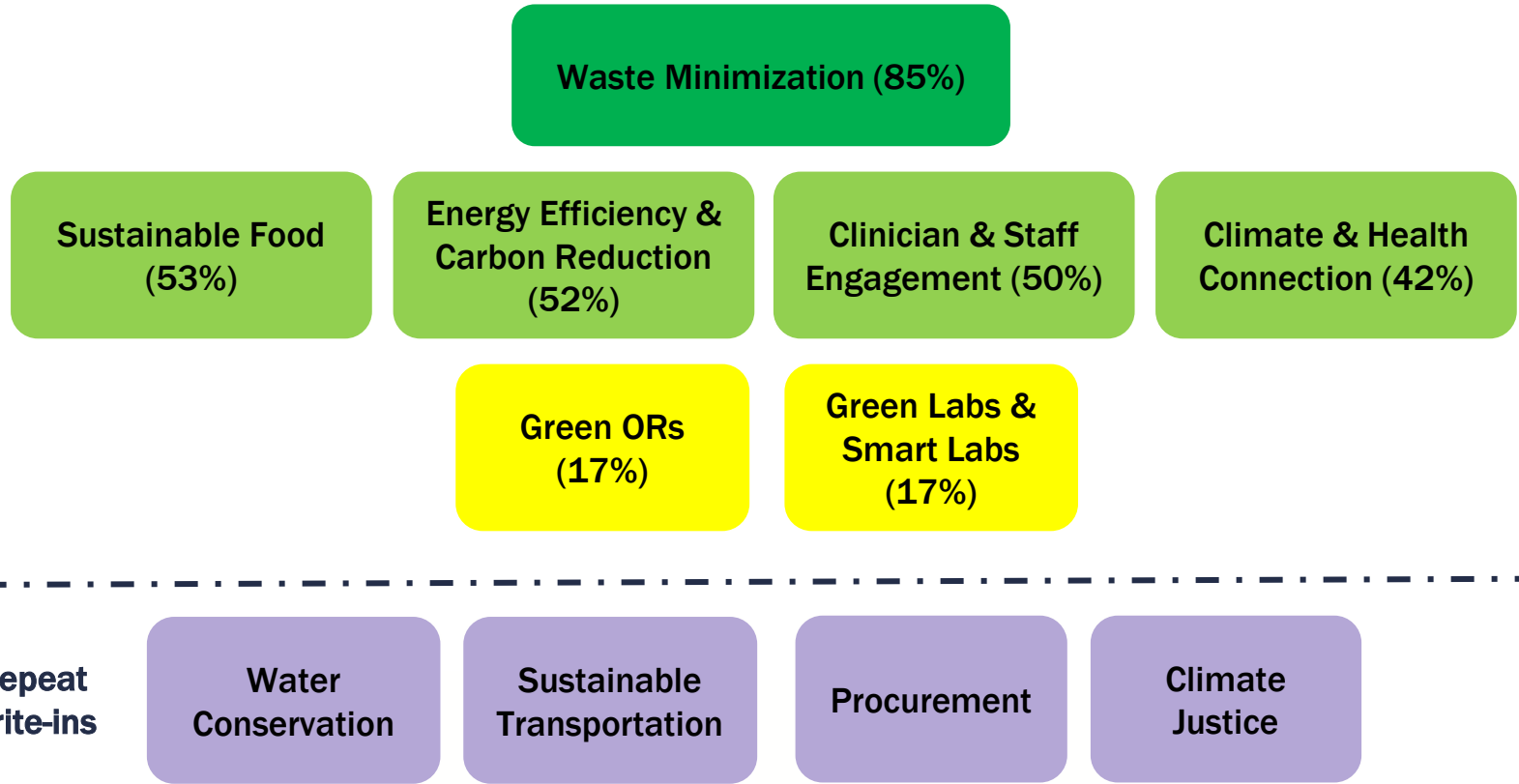
# 1. How interested are you in sustainability-related initiatives at UVA Health?

***Most respondents are very interested in sustainability***

- On a scale of 1-5, **94%** of respondents are 'moderately interested' (3) to 'very interested' (5) in sustainability initiatives
- **57%** of respondents are 'very interested' (5)



## 2. Which sustainability topics are most interesting? (% of respondents who selected the topic)



### 3. What type of engagement opportunities would you like to see?

Many respondents want to *take action and design solutions*



#### Incentives

Initiatives that encourage/incentivize sustainable actions (68%)



#### Communication

Sustainability-focused newsletter (45%) and direct listservs (20%)



#### Career

Professional development & continuing ed. (43%)



#### Working Groups

Working groups to explore solutions on specific topics (43%)



#### Programming

Sustainability-related events, such as webinars and tours (33%)



#### Guidance

Customized guidance, consultations and presentations (29%)

## 4. If you could make UVA Health more sustainable in one way, what would it be?

- **57%** of respondents provided one or more sustainability ideas
- The most common themes were **waste minimization, energy efficiency, and leadership support for sustainability**





## Key Takeaways

- The vast majority of UVA Health employees want to **see and act** on sustainability initiatives
  - There is motivation and support
- Employees will participate in these programs
  - **30% of respondents left their computing IDs for outreach**
- Need for administrators and clinician leaders to spearhead initiatives
